Passover's First Mention & Initial Instructions

- Exodus 12:1-13
 - What time of year is it?
 - What was to happen on the 10th day of the month?
 - What kind of animal was to be chosen?
 - How old?
 - Male or female?
 - In what condition?
 - What happened between the 10th and 14th day?
 - When was the lamb to be killed?
 - *in/beyn* (Strong's #996)- between
 - *evening/erev* (Strong's #6153)- dusk/evening
 - Where were they to put the blood?
 - How were they to cook the meat?
 - How were they to eat the meal?
 - The end of verse 11 is the first time we see "YHVH's passover"
 - *passover/pesach* (Strong's #6453)- exemption; also sacrifice of passover, animal victim of the passover, festival of the passover
 - What was God planning to do on that night?



The Instructions to Remember

- Exodus 12:14-20
 - How long are we to remember this day?
 - Breaking down verse 14:
 - memorial/*zikron* (Strong's #2146)- momento, record
 - keep/*chagag* (Strong's #2287)- move in a circle, march in a procession, observe a festival
 - feast/*chag* (Strong's #2282)- solemn feast, holiday
 - generations/*dor* (Strong's #1755)- a revolution of time, generation, dwelling, posterity
 - ordinance/*chuqqah* (Strong's #2708)- enactment, ordinance, appointed time
 - for ever/*olam* (Strong's #5769)- time out of mind, eternity, everlasting
 - In verses 15-20, what are we instructed to eat?
 - For how many days are we to eat this?
 - What are we instructed to do?
 - What would happen if someone ate yeast?
 - What was to be done on the first and seventh days of the feast?
 - What day of the first month was the Passover?
 - What day of the month was the first day of unleavened bread?
 - What day of the month was the seventh day of unleavened bread?
 - What is the only work that could be done on the first and seventh days of the feast?
 - For how long was the feast to be held?
 - How many days and on what days is matzo to be eaten?
 - What command and warning is repeated in verse 19?
 - Who does this command and warning pertain to?
 - Again, what was not to be eaten?



The First Passover

- **Exodus 12:22-27**
 - What did the Israelites use to apply the blood to their doorposts?
 - Where were they to stay until morning?
 - How long is this commanded feast valid?
 - Did the command to celebrate end when they came into the land?
 - Why was/is it important that we observe this service?
- **Exodus 12:28-42**
 - v. 28- What did the children of Israel do?
 - v. 34- What did the people do with their bread dough?
 - v. 38- Who went with the Israelites?
 - v. 39- What did they do with the bread dough they took with them? Why was the bread unleavened?
 - v. 43- Who was not to eat of the Passover?
 - stranger/*ben nekar* (Strong's #1121/5236)- foreigner, of heathendom, alien
 - v. 45- foreigner/*ger toshav* (Strong's #8453)- resident alien
 - v. 45- hired servant/*sawkeer* (Strong's #7916)- hireling, hired servant
 - v. 44- What must be done if a foreign slave (*eved*) wanted to eat of the Passover?
 - v. 46- Where was this Passover to be eaten?
 - v. 46- What was not to happen to any of the bones of the sacrificed lamb?
 - v. 48- If a foreigner (*ger*) wanted to eat the Passover, what must be done to all the males in his house?
 - v. 49- How did God adjust the commands for “strangers” as opposed to native-born Israelites?
