Why is the Passover so important?

Genesis 12: 1-8

- o Promise Go out (trust me and do what I say) and I shall make you a great nation (L'goy gadol)
- Promise I will bless you and make your name great
- o Promise I shall bless those who bless you and curse him who curses you
- Promise In you all the clans of the earth shall be blessed
 - Clans Mishpachot (families)
- Promise To your seed (descendants Zar'acha) I give this land

Genesis 13: 14-18

- o Promise For all the land... I shall give to you and your seed (descendants) forever
- Promise Seed (descendants) as dust of the earth

Genesis 14: 18-24

- Who is Melech 7adik?
- Melech- king
- Zadik- righteous/ righteousness
- o Traditionally the Melech Zadik is Shem
- Hebrews 11: 8-12
- Genesis 15: 1-6
 - Your reward is exceedingly great WHY? See (Gen 14:18-24)
 - He believed in Yahweh, and He reckoned it to him for righteousness
 - He believed and left his home Gen 12:1
 - He gave tithe to Melchizedek, the priest of the Most High El



- He kept his vow to the Most High El Gen 14:22-24
 - Heb 11: 8-12 By "BELIEF"...
- The significance of "heirs" introduced
- Promise Seed (descendants) as the stars of the heavens

Genesis 22: 15-18

- o The offering of Yitschak
- o The promises re-affirmed

Genesis 24: 59-60

• ...the blessing of Rivkah...who then marries Yitschak...

Genesis 26: 1-5

- o ...the promises passed on to Yitschak...
- The promises were passed on to Yitschak because Avraham obeyed...

• Genesis 28: 1-4

• The promises passed on to Ya'aqob ... Ya'aqob to become an assembly of peoples...

Genesis 28: 10-15

- o ...all the clans of the earth will be blessed through your seed...
- Verse 15 I am not going to leave you until I have done what I have spoken to you.

• Genesis 35: 9-12

o ...Ya'aqov re-affirmed as Yisra'el - Name first changed in Gen 32:28

• Genesis 45:1-10

- o Maybe the most dramatic scene in all of the Tanakh
- Why could Yosef see things the way he did?
